Just a little reminder that the deposits of £70.00 for both visits were due today - Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> September.

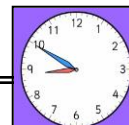
If you have not already paid, could you please pay at the school office as soon as possible. This deposit will secure your child's place for the visits.

## **Autumn Term 2017 Diary Dates**

Dear Parents,

We have been busy putting together all of the dates for this term so that they could be included in the first news bulletin of the 2017/18 academic year. We look forward to your continued support for the children by your attendance at celebration/class assemblies, productions, as well as offering them your support with fundraising events.

### **Enrichment Weeks**

Collapsed curriculum weeks will now be referred to as enrichment weeks, as this is exactly what they are intended to be. They are weeks that we use to enhance our curriculum. During an enrichment week the children will still be working, it is just a different way of offering them a range of experiences, as well as allowing us as a school to think creatively about how we deliver a broad and balanced curriculum. Throughout these carefully planned weeks, the children have the opportunity to work with outside providers, with children from different year groups and on a number of challenges that enhance curriculum skills that they need to learn or develop. Emmaville's curriculum is not just about maths, English or science, we ensure that the key skills, knowledge and understanding of all subjects is planned and taught. The curriculum webs that we regularly send out, and which are also posted on the school website, should highlight the skills that your children are learning through each topic taught. Creative Homework is also intended to enhance curriculum skills that will or have been taught in school.

### **Christmas**

This year we have decided to pay for the children's theatre tickets instead of buying them a Christmas present. However, we will be asking for a small contribution towards the cost of the transport. Pupils in the EYFS will be going to the Northern Stage to see a performance of 'Me'. Pupils in Year 1 and 2 will be going to the Tyne Theatre to see the pantomime 'Snow White'. One of our Year 6 pupils, Kate L, will be performing in the Snow White pantomime so we thought it would be lovely for the children to support Kate, and we hope that it may even encourage some children to want to follow in Kate's footsteps. Finally the children in Key Stage 2 will be going to the Arena to see Joe McEldry star in 'Joseph'.
